

Seven Curses

THE SEVEN CURSES ARE ONLY MARKERS FOR A DEEPER PROBLEM. Malachi 2:2 talks about God cursing the blessings He had previously given to a people group. Each of us was born with a gold mine and a toxic waste dump. The gold mine is our generational blessings but they can be negated by the toxic waste dump of our generational defilement.

These seven foundational curses can keep us from possessing our birthright and the different ways our finances are devoured indicate which one of the curses is neutralizing our blessings. The issue is not wealth; it is our being able to do everything God has called us to do.

THE ARAMEAN CURSE keeps a person from getting justice in any social structure. This is not only justice in courts but also extends to disputed business dealings with the landlord, the mechanic or the Little League coach.

THE MOABITE CURSE causes your income to be devoured before it gets to you. Promises are consistently made that are not kept. Another of its fruits is that most of your personal boundaries are routinely challenged.

THE PHILISTINE CURSE is most readily seen by your being a "second class citizen in an elitist organization." No matter what you have in actual abilities your leaders do not consider you qualified for the opportunities at hand.

THE CANAANITE CURSE causes you to be drawn to predatory authorities. You find it very difficult to actually leave and impossible to change the situation.

THE MIDIANITE CURSE is seasonal. People under this curse experience devouring of their money, their possessions and their relationships at the same time, year after year. Holidays, tend to be especially gruesome.

JOTHAM'S CURSE causes betrayal and devouring by those inside the camp. This can cause a pattern of church splits or embezzlement by business partners.

THE AMMONITE CURSE is marked by an invasion of one's boundaries. The consequence of this invasion is the loss of your children, not just your money. Children raised under this curse seem to lose touch with God as they become adults. There is no definable trauma, but no matter how zealous they were as youth the fire goes out and they become uncharacteristically spiritually passive.
