The lies we live by can have a great negative impact on our walk with God. Let me begin here by sharing my personal experience with this reality.

I was born again in August 1976. It was a dramatic, powerful experience. I was desperately in love with Jesus. About 18 months later I was baptized in the Holy Spirit. In July of 1979, God called me to full time ministry. Then on February 10th, 1980 Father gave me a vision and called Gerri and I to a Christian Retreat Ministry. In June of 1982 we obeyed His instruction to quit my job and 'go' and we did. It wasn't until Sept 2001 that we heard the message of Father's love. What a life changing revelation that has been! It was totally opposite to the devastating lie I believed about Father God.

Up to that time I believed Father was out there some where in Heaven and He was angry and carried a big stick and if I didn't keep Jesus between me and Him, I was toast. Father was too holy to approach and too angry to be close to. This dramatic lie about Him and me kept me from Him and His love for me. I desperately needed to experience His love to bring healing to my extensive love hunger issues, but I was ignorant. I didn't know He was available. I didn't know I had access by the Blood of Jesus to my Father.

For me, the lie I believed about Him carried the power of truth. Therefore, a relationship with Him was impossible. Besides, why would I want to be close to an angry Father? Then in Sept 2001 we heard the truth about Father and the lie was broken. I quickly repented and cried out to Him. I felt clean and new. I felt free. I felt born again, again.

We finally met Father in January 2004 and we have never been the same. The reality of His love and the transformational power of His love has been overwhelming. We are desperate to bring this truth to the Body of Christ and see every born again Child of God washed in the power of Father's love and acceptance. What is your opinion of Father?
